

## September 2021 Update

**September 22, 2021**--Classes are well underway and students have been able to take advantage of the new renovations to their schools. Every Channelview ISD campus will receive upgrades thanks to the 2019 Bond project.

The new Career and Technical Education (CTE) facility is being used by students. Students are already using the new welding room, robotics center and culinary arts kitchen for hands-on learning. Crews continue to work on the auditorium. The speakers and seats have been installed and the stage has been painted black. The auditorium should be complete by the end of October.

"Students are here and classes are in full swing. It is such a blessing for our students to be able to see the renovations made to their campus," said Interim Superintendent Dr. Don Beck. "This would not have been made possible without our community. Our voters are the reason our students have these upgrades and I want to thank them for their support."

Alice Johnson Junior High renovations are nearly complete. There are only a few minor changes that need to be finished. The new canopy that oversees the main entrance continues to be worked on. The canopies to the band hall have been added and the logo has been painted to the auxiliary and competition gym.

Crews have begun working on the maintenance and transportation facility. Renovations to this facility are also part of the 2019 Bond project. Currently, crews have begun work on the detention pond and the addition of the new parking lot.



Significant progress has been made to the new McGhee Elementary site. The storm lines and drains have been installed to the campus. In addition, the curbs have been poured around the site. Steel continues to be installed throughout several areas. Crews are also working to fireproof the steel that has been added.
